

Under her leadership, we have established a more community-based mechanism for selection of musicals for the upcoming season, provided open forums for the MTS community to discuss financial issues with the Board, enacted policies to promote personal safety in the theater and set up our *#SaveMTS* campaign to help us maintain financial sustainability. Her dedication has helped us to keep *community* in our community theater, and we are most grateful to her for her hard work.

# How the Board Works to Serve MTS

It has come to our attention that not everyone knows what it really means to be a board member of MTS, so we wanted to take a moment to answer this question as best we can on a fairly broad sense.

Members of the Board of Directors are unpaid volunteers who contribute their time and efforts to helping MTS at an administrative level to produce musicals with the high quality that Albuquerque audiences have come to expect in our local theater community. Unlike many professional companies, the MTS Board functions as a working body that engages in all of the activities that a Managing Director and full-time paid staff would normally perform.

This administrative function requires approximately 24 to 40 hours a week per board member to ensure MTS is able to operate on a daily basis. As such, MTS' infrastructure is divided into a number of permanent standing committees on which the board serves with other members of the MTS community. Often board members will be a part of multiple committees.

The committees are as follows:

Development and Outreach Educational Facility and Office Finance History and Archive Marketing and Media MTS Amigos Nominations Policy and Bylaws Production and Artistic Quality Show and Director Selection

Each committee meets regularly to operate MTS with the assurance that our theater company provides a safe, comfortable working environment for actors and crew, abides by 501c3 non-profit laws, promotes the theatrical productions in the media, raises funds to maintain the operations of the theater including rent, utilities, legal costs, maintenance, and promotes the educational aspects for theater in Albuquerque to name just a few tasks.

The Board meets on the third Saturday every month to discuss and decide on things affecting the theatre in varying ways as presented by the various committees. (Continued on p. 4)


